WORLD motor-cycle champion Mike Hailwood won the main event at the Daily Express-sponsored "Hutchinson 100" motor-cycle meeting at Silverstone.

He made his first appearance in Britain this year on his world - beating Italian M.V. machine.

His victory in the 500 c.c. race on Saturday won him the Daily Express Trophy. He won at an average speed of 89.11 miles an hour, ahead of Phil Read, who was on a Matchless.

rider from Birmingham, who collected
his fourth victory in 12 days and with his speed of 81.12 miles an hour came nearest to the lap record.

The trophy goes to the rider whose average speed is the nearest

in any class.

Jim Redman, the double world champion in the 250 world champion in the 250 and 350 classes, was regarded as favourite to collect the trophy for the third consecutive year but the blustery, rainy conditions cut down his speed in the 350 class, which he won at 86.09 miles an hour.

Alan Shepherd, from Grange-over-Sands, riding the East German M.Z., won the 250 race at 83.33 miles an hour, just 2.2sec. ahead of the Belfast rider Tommy Robb on a Honda.
